## School Organisation

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Well week 8 is almost complete and we're staring down week 9, which is only 3 and a half days in total. Terms go so fast and I think that this one being very action-packed and busy has made the time fly!

### SCHOOL CHAPLAIN

Rose Amy has settled into her new role in a local secondary school this week. It was wonderful to see Rose at Big Hill PS for quite a while on Tuesday morning, helping our new chaplain, Megan Haddon, settle in. Megan enjoyed visiting all classes and also met up with the Student Voice crew (along with Rose) to set up future work of the group. Just reminding you, if your child was seeing Rose 1:1, you will need to drop into the Office and get a new consent form signed to enable Megan to work with your child. If, at any time, you would like the chaplain to work with your child, particularly if they are struggling with any number of wellbeing issues, please drop in, grab a form and fill it out. Feel free to let me know if you require any information about Megan and her program. Please remember that the chaplain does not cover any religious content with your child/ren. Their role is purely as a counsellor and support.

### PARENTS AND FRIENDS

Our P&F have been very busy with quite a few activities occurring to help raise valuable funds for our school. A recent hot cross bun drive was trialled – thanks to families that supported this.

There is currently an Easter raffle underway – with tickets sent home to each family to sell. Please try and sell your tickets and if not, please return them to the Office.

Children (and some big children) are also enjoying the GUESS THE EASTER EGGS IN THE JAR competition....this is located at the Office. Follow the rabbit footprints to locate the competition. Raffle and competition winners will be drawn/announced next week on Thursday – good luck!

Tomorrow is also the P&F Movie Night – with a screening of THE INCREDIBLES in preparation for the upcoming release in cinemas of THE INCREDIBLES 2. By now, you will probably have organised your child's entry (free of charge) and paid for snack packs and sausage in bread. Please remember that there is no entry to the movie night if your child has not bought a ticket prior to today. Only Big Hill PS students can attend the movie night and P&F are also welcoming any offers of parental help. If you wish to stay during the event, please ensure you are listed as a volunteer, otherwise enjoy a few hours of peace and quiet. Our P&F is a very active and hardworking group that always welcomes new members and offers of assistance. If you haven't already joined the P&F Facebook page, I suggest you do so! It's a great way to stay up-to-date with what is happening in the school community thanks to the work of this group.

### **TEAM CHINA – OVERSEAS LEARNING EXPERIENCE**

Just reminding families of children travelling that we have the second instalment due (\$700) before the end of term. I think most of you have paid this. The full balance is due after the April holidays. A big thank you to all families for spending time with me filling in Chinese Visa applications and delivering passports. I have delivered these to our contact, ready to be sent off for processing. I do need each of the families to indicate to me if their child wants to do an overnight stay (or stays – 2 nights) OR an evening meal ASAP. Could all 4 families please email me what their child is wanting (even if you have told me). I also suggest if you have hosted a Chinese student and are planning for your child to stay with them, that you have (or will soon) made contact with the Chinese family in Suzhou and have started to loosely organise this. You have the dates etc in the itinerary to guide you. For those indicating that their child wants to stay with a new family (as they haven't hosted or the family in China haven't indicated they will return the favour), I will organise this with our Suzhou contact and let you know, when I know, the arrangements for any stays organised.

### **TEAM CHINA – FUNDRAISING**

Zooper Doopers continue to sell immediately after school at the canteen - \$1. Thanks to the children and families who continue to support this fundraising activity. Don't forget our great black or gold bands at the Office – the perfect size for your child's wrist. Why not buy one when you next visit? Stock is quickly reducing and we won't be ordering more....so don't miss out!

### **ORAL HEALTH SCREENING**

We've had a very busy Office area this week, with the Chaplain's area set up as a dental health check area. Many families have taken up the offer to have their children's oral health assessed, which is great to see. The importance of good oral hygiene cannot be underestimated. The key messages given to the children by the professionals on site have been 1: Brush your teeth every day – morning and night, and 2: When brushing teeth, ensure this is done thoroughly over all teeth (front, back and top) for at least two minutes.

### **CONJUNCTIVITIS**

There have been a couple of confirmed cases of conjunctivitis at school in the past week. Conjunctivitis appears as a sore eye, sometimes quite red or bloodshot, before deteriorating into tacky, gooey secretions in the eye (a bit like "sleep") making the eye sticky when opening and closing. Conjunctivitis is extremely contagious and a visit to the doctor is required to get medication to address the infection. If your child contracts conjunctivitis, please see a doctor and ensure they are not at school for a full 24 hours once the medical treatment (usually drops) has commenced.

### **THANK YOU TO THE CHAPMAN FAMILY**

A big thank you to the Chapman family who sourced and delivered a large rock from the Ravenswood Interchange Roadworks to our school on Monday. The rock has been positioned near the new climbing spire, ready to have a plaque attached recognising the monetary contributions of the Parents & Friends AND the Frances & Harold Abbott Foundation for the climbing spire and the extension to the Junior Playground. Much appreciated Shane and Deb.

### **TYRES**

I'm conscious of families removing waste (including tyres) incurring a cost to take to the tip. I'm suggesting that the remaining tyres (near the blue skip bin) are only removed if you have the capacity to store them away on your property or re-use them in some fashion. They aren't in good shape, so suggest that the best course of action is to just dispose of them (if you have a junk yard on your property) or be creative and use them for gardens etc. The cost of disposing each tyre at the tip would equate to quite a bit of money, so the school does not want any family to have to bear this cost. If there are no takers after the holidays, we may look at disposing of them ourselves. What would help is if someone could actually remove the bolts between each tyre, making them easier to dispose of in the future. Is this something you can do?

### **SCHOOL COUNCIL AGM AND MARCH MEETING**

Our Annual General Meeting went well on Tuesday night, with new members present and all office bearer positions filled. Congratulations to Jonathan Westcott, who was successfully re-elected as our School Council President for another term. Dave Fear has stepped into the role of Vice School Council President, whilst Kate Lamprell has been elected into the Treasurer position. Pauline Mulcair has kindly accepted nominations as our Secretary and Minute Secretary for the coming term too! Well done to all concerned and thank you for being prepared to take on these important roles for the next 12 months. Our March meeting occurred after the AGM, with much discussion around the Capital Works program in particular. As part of the role of School Council, the group looked at the costings of the project and identified areas that need to be cut from the plans to ensure the project comes in under budget. School Council will meet next for an extraordinary meeting on Tuesday, 24<sup>th</sup> April to look over the 2017 Annual Report to the School Community.

### **MAKE SURE YOU READ THIS SECTION!**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$125 for primary school students and \$225 for secondary school students. Contact the Office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the CSEF website. Parents/carers are reminded that all CSEF applications are due before the end of Term 1 (March 29<sup>th</sup>). We can't apply for this on your behalf – so please make sure you put in an application if eligible. If you received CSEF funding in 2017 at Big Hill Primary School, you do not need to reapply. If you are unsure, please check.

## **STUDENT AND ATTENDANCE AWARDS**

Traditionally, on the last day of term, Big Hill PS presents students with Attendance and Student Awards. For those new to the school, each class teacher (including our Visual Arts teacher) will present awards to a student from their room in the following areas: EXCELLENCE IN ENGLISH, EXCELLENCE IN MATHEMATICS, ENDEAVOUR IN ENGLISH, ENDEAVOUR IN MATHEMATICS, EXCELLENCE IN VISUAL ARTS and OUTSTANDING DEMONSTRATION OF SCHOOL VALUES. 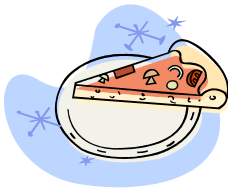
