Dear Parents/Guardians,

Week 4 has almost come to an end and with that, we are approaching the mid part of Term. It's hard to believe how quickly time goes by, but this is due mainly to school days being so busy. Next week is particularly busy with our final review day on Monday, then the NAPLAN testing for Years 3 and 5 on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

NAPLAN TESTING – YEARS 3 AND 5 NEXT WEEK

As outlined last week, testing of our Year 3 and 5 students will occur in the morning sessions of Tuesday, 15th, Wednesday, 16th and Thursday, 17th May – next week. If your child is in Year 3 or 5, please ensure they are well-rested the nights before testing AND at school on time, as the tests occur soon after 9:00am. If your child misses a test, we make every effort to catch them up before the end of the week. If you were considering having your child miss school to avoid the tests, please come and see me to exempt your child from the tests – a much better option than missing 3 days of school. Information sheets regarding the testing will be sent home with each Year 3 and 5 child. Please look for this in your child's bag.

SCHOOL REVIEW – FINAL DAY MONDAY

On Monday, we will once again be visited by our Reviewer (Toni), Senior Education Improvement Leader (Leonie) and Challenge Partners (Trudi and Trish) to bring together the 3 days completed as part of our review of 2015-2018. By the end of the day, the group will have a clear sense of what our future goals for Big Hill PS will be – 2019 – 2022. Once the final report is handed over to the school, I will share findings with School Council and our community via the newsletter. Watch this space.

ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL SURVEY

In the coming weeks, all students in Years 4 – 6 will complete an online ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL SURVEY (AToSS). The survey measures the performance of the school and perception of the student across several areas, including safety, classroom behaviour, teaching and learning, engagement, confidence, resilience, relationships etc. Once complete, all responses are de-identified (ie. No one can tell who responded in what way) and collated to produce a measure to see how our school is travelling in the eyes of our students. As part of our current review, AToSS data has been used heavily to look at trends to celebrate successes and indicate areas of future improvement.

TEAM CHINA – OVERSEAS LEARNING EXPERIENCE

Our final PRE – DEPARTURE DAY occurred yesterday at Golden Square Primary School. Lachie, Charli, Ciana, Abi and I enjoyed the afternoon, mixing with the other travellers whilst completing a variety of activities. We had bartering lessons, refreshed some of our Mandarin Chinese language, learnt how to wash our tshirts in a hotel sink and viewed videos of the streets and railway stations of Shanghai in preparation. With less than two weeks to go, the 5 of us are getting very excited to travel abroad with such a large group of students and staff from Bendigo. This year, 49 students will travel to China, with 14 staff supporting. We depart on Wednesday, 23rd May and return on Saturday, 2nd June. YEAR 6 – YEAR 7 TRANSITION FORMS

If you haven't already, **please return your child's YEAR 6 TO YEAR 7 TRANSITION: APPLICATION FOR YEAR 7 PLACEMENT 2019 form by tomorrow.** The transition pack was sent home to each family early last week and your designated school was indicated in the form. This year, your closest local school (a direct measure from home to school "as the crow flies") is used to determine what school your child has an allocated place. Some past rules have now ceased, meaning that what once might have happened with placement won't happen anymore....for example, if you are rurally located, you automatically go to your closest geographical school rather than getting to choose. The sibling rule has also been changed to only allow placement at the given school if that location has the capacity to do so. Be mindful that just because your child has a sibling at a given school, does not automatically mean that you will get a place. It's also important to note that if you do get a school beyond the one deemed "local" and you will rely on bus travel, your child will become a fare paying student (\$125 a term). Free bus travel only applies for students going to their designated school. The transition pack sent home outlines all of these scenarios well, so if you haven't read it, I suggest you do so. By close of business tomorrow, we will start collating lists of students for each school and send these off to each Secondary College. If we get no form returned from a family, we place a child at their designated school based on distance from home to school. Spare copies of the transition packs are available at the school if you need another.

MOTHERS' DAY STALL

ANNUAL REPORT 2017

Last week I shared with you our School Context. This week, please enjoy reading our FRAMEWORK FOR IMPROVING STUDENT OUTCOMES (FISO) section : In 2016, our focus at Big Hill PS was on EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AND LEARNING – both Building Practice Excellence and Curriculum Planning and Assessment. Whilst our improvement areas for that calendar year were achieved, this work was not small by nature and therefore completed thoroughly in one calendar year. It is due to this that our school continued to focus once again in 2017 on the two EXCELLENCE areas....enabling us to delve deeper. In 2017, there was a focus on writing (whilst maintaining the momentum achieved in reading) and speaking and listening. 2017 was also a year of major focus on mathematics. In 2016 Assessments were trialled, in 2017 assessment practises were implemented across literacy and numeracy with data used to inform teaching and learning across the school. In addition to this, planning was aligned across units, with consistency across the school and linked to the Victorian Curriculum. By doing this, we aligned with the final years of our Strategic Plan...particularly through focused work on numeracy. The 2016 data analysis of NAPLAN indicated growth in curriculum areas, however, there are still areas to address, such as cohort growth in numeracy and writing. Whilst some of data indicated growth, other sets suggest continued work in the improvement initiatives chosen. Growth takes time, so at Big Hill, we continued to focus on moving all of our data sets in a positive direction. We are hopeful that our 2018 NAPLAN data will be reflective of our focus on EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AND LEARNING.

SCHOOL COUNCIL – TUESDAY NIGHT
