PRINCIPALS CONFERENCE – TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY

Sharyn Burnett and I spent two days at the North Western Victoria Region (NWVR) Principals Forum in Melbourne. Along with all other Principals and Assistant Principals in our Region, we were briefed by the Minister James Merlino, Secretary Gill Callister, Deputy Secretary Bruce Armstrong and NWVR Regional Director Janette Nagorcka. In addition to this, we attended sessions with experts from New Zealand, Canada and other countries leading the way in education. Whilst it is mandatory for Sharyn and I to attend, it was certainly wonderful to know the school was in good hands and I thank Kate Dole, Renae Westley, Kerry Prentice, Janet Dean and our staff for keeping things going smoothly at Big Hill PS during our absence.

SCHOOL COUNCIL – NEXT TUESDAY

Just a reminder to School Councillors of our June meeting next Tuesday, 19th June. Finance Committee members will meet at 6:30pm, with the Council meeting commencing at 7:00pm in the library. As we need a quorum at each meeting, parents are reminded to attend each meeting where possible...due to this, I'm hoping we manage to have the majority of members present on Tuesday night. ANNUAL REPORT 2017

The final section of the 2017 Annual Report is WELLBEING: In 2017, the new online Attitudes to School Survey (AToSS) was introduced, including Year 4 students for the first time. On the AToSS our Years 4, 5 and 6 students' connectedness to our school was similar to like schools, staying above the state median. 84% of those surveyed were positive (up from 73% in 2016). Year 4's were very positive, Year 5's similar with 85% positive endorsement, whilst Year 6's were less positive with 70%. Year 6 girls endorsed the school favourably with 91%, however the boys were less positive in Year 6 (58%). This was a small group of 11 students, with 2 PSD funded students with challenging behaviours. Due to the change to AToSS and the inclusion of Year 4 students, there is no 4 year trend data to compare to. Management of Bullying on the AToSS in 2017 was positively endorsed as similar to like-schools, however the performance of Big Hill PS was above the State median. Management of Bullying was 87% positively endorsed, with Year 4's at 85%, Year 5's at 91% and Year 6's at 83%. Girls (across the 3 year levels) were very positive (89 – 100%), however the boys results varied and less positive – Year 4 79%, Year 5 83% and Year 6 79%. It appears that in both factors measured, our work lies with the boys in Years 4-6.

ATTENDANCE

Just a reminder to text 0438 738 788 or call the Office when your child is away from school. If this can be done before 10:00am on the day, it will save you the hassle of a call from the Office. Remember to state why your child is away – as we must code each absence accurately for the Department of Education and Training (DET). Attendance awards will be presented on the last day of term for children who have achieved 2 days or less absence during Term 2. Those with 100% attendance will get a special certificate and prize as a result. At this stage Attendance Bands are on reorder and may not arrive on time. If this occurs, bands will be presented after the July holidays.

READING GOAL

By the end of this term, your child should have achieved 100 nights of reading. At this stage, many of our children in Prep – Year 2 have done this and have received a certificate at assembly. Congratulations to our students and families who are on track to reach 100 nights of reading – or a well beyond this target! Your efforts at home really do make a difference to your child's reading ability. If you are unaware of how many nights your child has read (including students in Years 3-6), it's a sign that you might need to check in with your child and ensure reading is occurring and that it is being documented in diaries. If you are unsure, please talk to your child's teacher.

PROPOSED STUDENT REPORTING DAY

I have only had one parent indicate their views on a new structure for the student reporting day – proposed for Tuesday, 31st July. Due to this, we will proceed to School Council level to make a decision regarding the proposed day and inform the community of the outcome early... enabling families to make the necessary arrangements to attend interviews and also have their child/ren with them for the day (and at the interview). As this will be discussed next Tuesday night at School Council, I will be able to give you a definite outline of what will happen in next week's newsletter.

PETER NASH – RETIREMENT

As announced last week, Mr Peter Nash has retired formally as of the end of this term. Rhys Bull will continue with Peter's class into next term and a selection process will occur to put a teacher in place for a longer term position. It would be lovely to just extend Rhys until the end of the year, but DET regulations require us to readvertise, even if we just wanted to continue as we have been. Peter has not indicated when he will return to Big Hill PS for a farewell. I think it was a very hard decision for him and saying goodbye is never easy. If you are wanting to write him a letter, send him a card etc feel free to drop these to the Office where we can organise them to be delivered to him. I'm still hopeful of having a formal farewell for Peter – I think the children would love that, but cannot guarantee when that will happen as the timing and visit are entirely up to Peter. I'll keep you posted.

KANGAROO FLAT BUS – MYKI

Parents are reminded to ensure that children travelling on the Kangaroo Flat bus have adequate money on their MYKI. As this is public transport, it is illegal to travel without payment. I have had contact from the bus driver indicating that several students have repeatedly had no money on their MYKI and if this was to continue, travel on the bus will be refused. Please ensure you have a MYKI that is topped up ready to travel to avoid the hassle of a phone call to come and pick up your child in the event that travel is refused.

TEAM CHINA OVERSEAS LEARNING EXPERIENCE – FINAL POST DEPARTURE DAY

A reminder to the families of students who travelled to China to please return permission forms for next Wednesday's Post-departure Day at Golden Square Primary School. This event is an opportunity to get feedback from the students who participated in the trip around what they really enjoyed, what they didn't enjoy and how the trip could be improved. This information is put to good use when planning the OSLE for 2019. A reminder to all current Year 4's and 5's of the opportunity to travel to China next year (May/June 2019) – an expression of interest form will be sent home in Term 3. A great way to almost guarantee your child a place is to host a Chinese student in Term 4. Families host for 4 weeks and are supported by the school financially and by key staff (including our Chinese teacher) during this period. To simplify the report template, Staff have worked hard to create a new format that is easier to read and ascertain how one's child is going at school. There will still be written comments, however, we have cut these back to ensure they are more succinct and to the point for parents. Kate Dole has done a huge amount of work setting up the new system and I thank her for all of her efforts. Well done Kate!

Reports will be sent home at the end of the school term with your child. Please look for them in your child's bag. If you require a second set of reports due to a split family arrangement, please ensure you have notified the Office of the requirement to send home an extra copy...or details of where it is to be emailed.

FAREWELL TASH

Tomorrow Tash Turpie will spend her last day with Senior Ainsley (SA), as she begins a long term commitment with another school until the end of the year. This will mean we won't see Tash again this year, so it's only fitting to thank her for all of the hard work she has put into our school and for the great relationships she has formed with the students at Big Hill PS. She will be missed! To ensure a smooth end of the term for the children in SA, Amanda Bateman will return from Family Leave for two weeks to ensure Ainsley's 5/6's have a nice end to the term. From the commencement of Term 3, Ainsley will return to her normal duties. We look forward to welcoming her back!

CURRICULUM DAY

Last Friday was well spent on Koorie Cultural Training and the Respectful Relationships program. Both sessions were very useful opportunities to check how we are going in each area. Our work with Koorie students will continue to be a priority, aligning with DET's Marrung Education Plan in coming years, whilst Respectful Relationships will be launched next term to build respect and gender equity in our students – with the hope that one day all Australians will respect women. This initiative is nationwide across all sectors of society – you may have seen some of the new commercials. Education is just one platform where efforts will be made to address attitudes to girls and women in Australian society. From Term 3, we will begin to teach compulsory curriculum to all of our students at Big Hill PS. LITERACY

Next week the Middle Unit will be working on the CAFÉ area of Comprehension to critique texts. Students will also continue work on their individual CAFE goals in one of the four areas; Comprehension, Accuracy, Fluency, Expand Vocab.

We are asking for **25 pledges** by people who bank with the Bendigo Bank or have an account with Bendigo Telco at no cost to them.

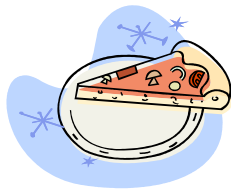
